


Middleton 100% Renewable Energy Resolution – 2018-32

- City establishes goals to meet 100% of their energy needs with renewable energy by 2040
- City establishes goals to meet 100% of communitywide energy needs with renewable energy by 2050
- City will prioritize local and micro-grid-based renewable energy projects over remote generation and transmission
- City will develop a resiliency plan to deal with anticipated changes associated with climate change



Shared Solar Initiative

- 500 kW solar array on the Middleton Municipal Operations Center
- 100 kW solar array on the Middleton Police Department (25% of building's electricity use)
- 5 MW solar array at Middleton Municipal Airport (city purchases 0.5 MW and School District purchases 1 MW with a Renewable Energy Rider (RER) agreement





Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Policy

- Goal: Mitigate climate change and adapt to our changing environment
- Middleton has incentivized ~1.5 MW of solar PV for 11 TID projects

Action A: Partner with Dane County and other agencies to administer equitable energy efficiency programs for homeowners, renters, and businesses that reduce both energy costs and greenhouse gas emissions. Middleton will prioritize assistance to those who need it the most and for those who have been historically excluded from economic opportunities due to a legacy of unjust policies and racism.




The Need

- HOUSING RESILIENCE: We have an affordable housing shortage in Middleton. Need to build more units while also preserving and investing in our existing stock.
- EQUITY: Research shows that for working families, rent, utilities, and transportation costs are amongst the highest monthly expenses, especially those most impacted by COVID
- CLIMATE CHANGE: Affordable housing consumes on average 33% more energy than market rate housing because it is generally older and has deferred maintenance.
- ACCESS: Decrease time and effort in identifying efficiency opportunities and accessing benefits/incentives.


What is the **Efficiency Navigator**? w/ Elevate Energy and Sustain Dane

The program's aim is to help small to medium size multi-family housing become more efficient and resilient while reducing operating costs to remain affordable.






Navigator Process


